



- Error message in Monitor in regards to "Could not find compiler..."
- For example

COMPILE/LINK

Code Manager

ERROR(): Could not find compiler "<compiler\_name>" root path "<path\_to\_compiler>" --please refer to the option "Tool Root Path" in section "External
Tools|Compiler|<compiler\_name>" of the associated options dialog

INFO(): ... or change the used compiler

ERROR(): <Compile> command aborted



#### **Answer:**

- Option a) Select a compiler that is installed:
  - File > Properties... > Build > Compiler: Select a compiler that is installed
- Option b) Enter correct path to compiler:
  - File > Properties ... > Build > Edit Compiler Settings > Tool Root Path: Select correct path to compiler

## 1 Borland V4.5

- ERROR(): Could not find compiler "Borland-C V4.5" root path "c:\bc45\" --- please refer to the option "Tool Root Path" in section "External Tools\Compiler\Borland-C V4.5" of the associated options dialog
- This message regularly shows up when opening an old PC experiment where the compiler setting was set to Borland V4.5
- This was the default compiler setting in old ASCET versions
- In ASCET V6.3.0, the default compiler for the PC experiment was switched from Borland V4.5 to GCC V4.7.2
- ASCET V6.4.2 no longer ships the Borland V4.5 Compiler



- PC experiments will use GCC V4.7.2
- The Borland V4.5 compiler continues to be supported by ASCET, but you must buy and install the compiler separately
