



Error: XML file userSettings.xml is not valid. Root Tag <Settings> expected.



• When I start ASCET the following error shows up:



- XML file c:\<PATH>\userSettings.xml is not valid. Root Tag <Settings> expected.
 - For older ASCET versions the path of the file in the error message may look different:



- When I open the mentioned file with text editor, I find out that it is an empty file.
- Also another file called externaltoolsettings.xml was reporting the same error
 - And it was also empty
- When I click the **OK** button the dialog does not go away:
 - I have to shut down ASCET via Windows Task Manager






Solution 1

 Get the same file from a colleague and paste the content into the according file at your machine

Solution 2

- Start ASCET and you will get the error
- Click 24 times on **OK** button to make the error disappear
- Dialog closes and ASCET starts
- Delete the file that was mentioned in the error message
- Close ASCET



 Result: While closing, ASCET will create a new file and from next time, you will not be getting this error.



- Although this behavior occurs very seldom: the experts at ETAS managed to identify a possible root cause
 - The virus protection may block the complete saving of the userSettings.xml during shutdown of ASCET
 - Because of that the file is just incomplete after closing ASCET.
 - Solution in order to prevent such situation in future:
 - Exclude the complete folder from virus scan
