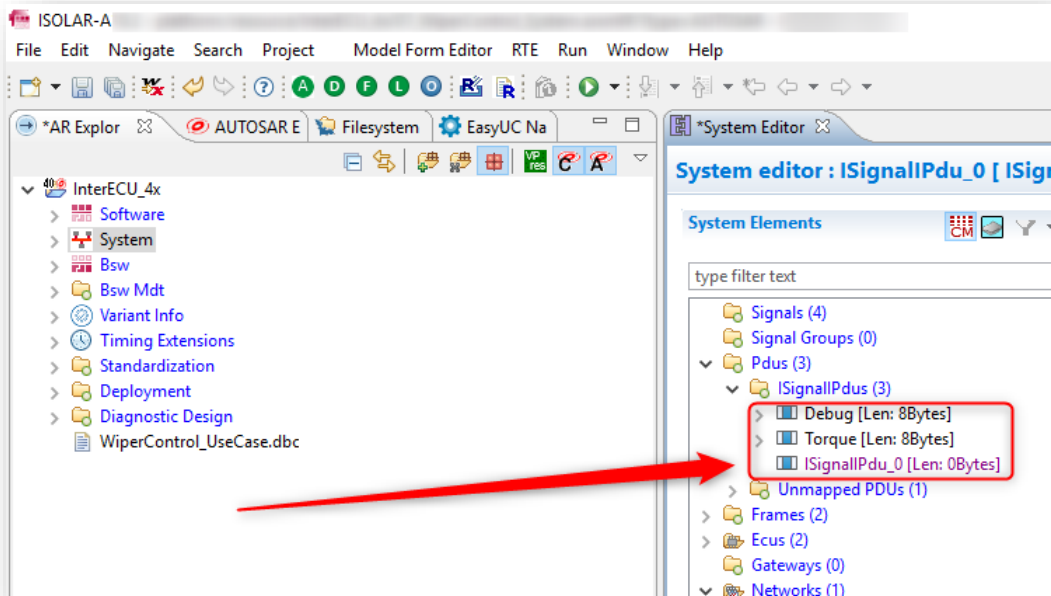




## Question:

- In **System Editor** there is a PDU displayed in violet font color

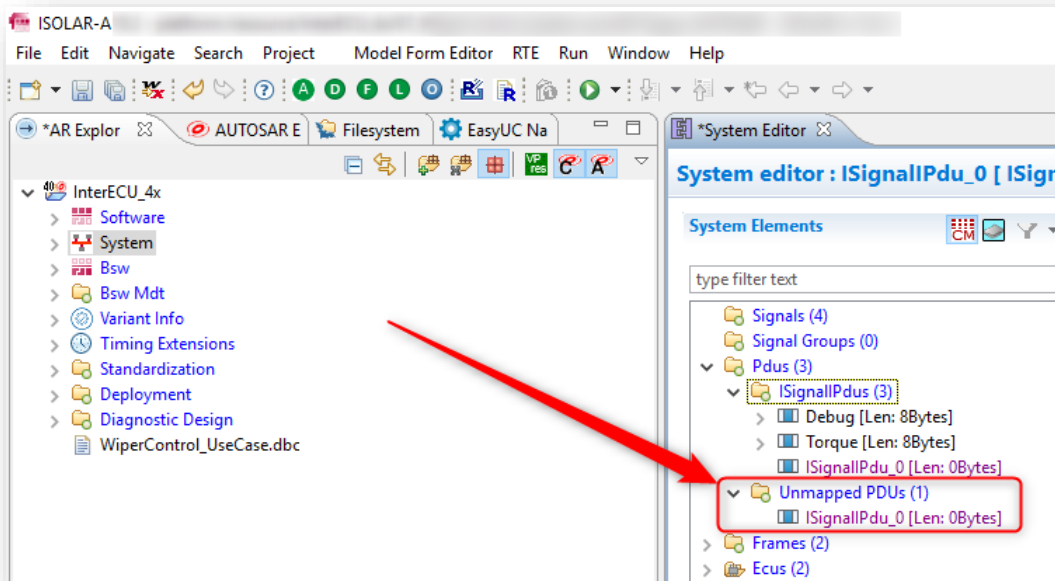


- What does the violet font color mean?



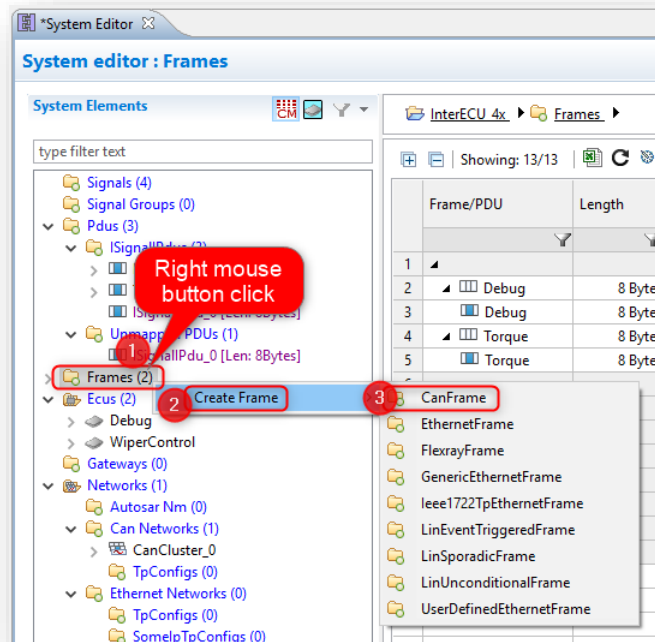
## Answer:

- When a PDU is displayed in violet font color then it is not mapped to a **Frame**
- The PDU is also listed under folder **Unmapped PDUs**

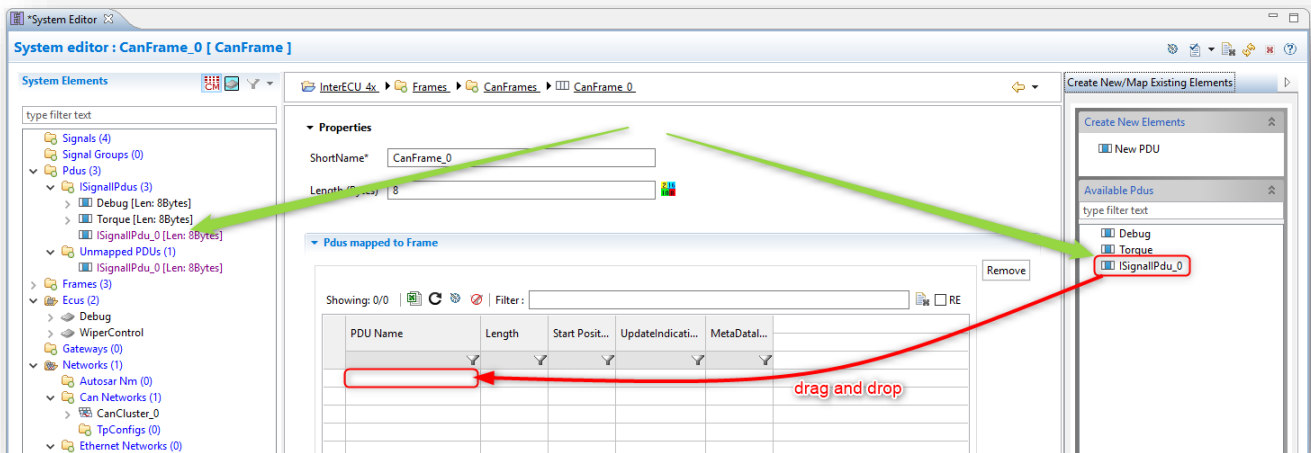


## Map the PDU to a Frame

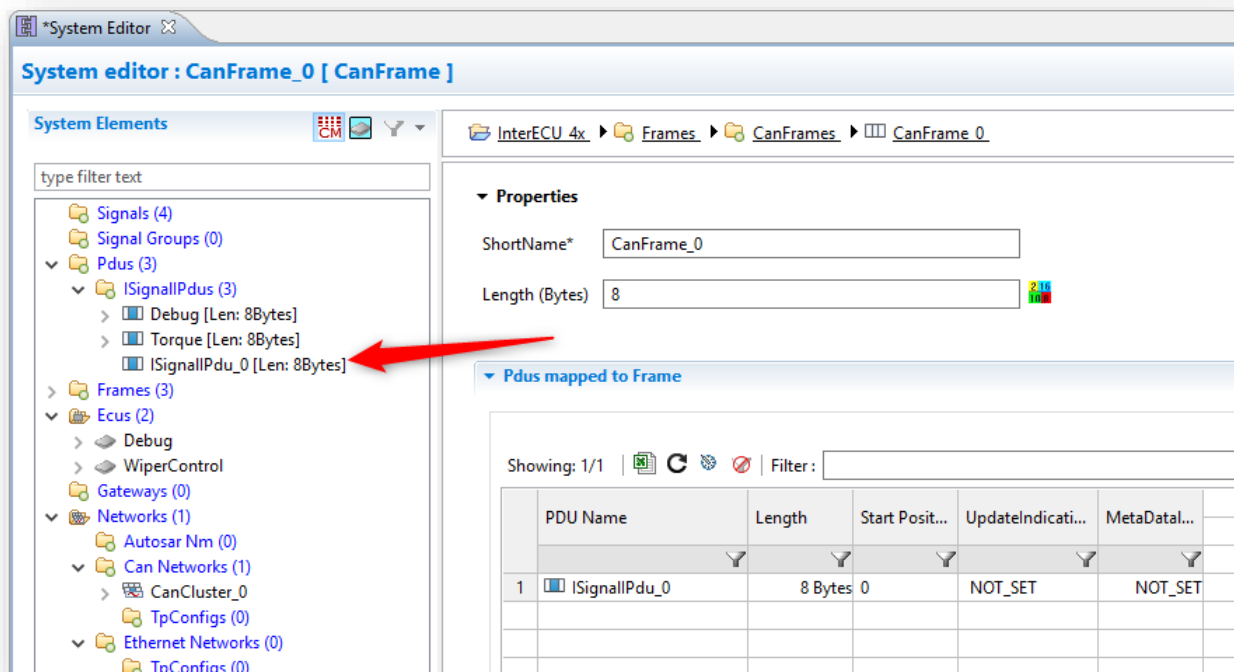
1. Create a new frame (for example a CAN frame): On **Frames** → Right mouse button click → **Create Frame** → **CanFrame**



2. On right hand side, under **Available Pdus:** Drag and drop the unmapped PDU into the table on panel **Pdus mapped to Frame**



3. Result: The PDU is mapped to a Frame → Font color is black now
